How to access:

- 1) From work or home go to: www.sdhl.org.uk
 - 2) On the homepage click the Knowledge & Library Hub **Search** button to start your search
- OR** visit www.library.nhs.uk/torbay

Search for journal articles, e-books and print books **all in one place.**

Access the full-text of articles and eBooks (where available) or submit an online request.

Avoid the less-reliable sources that a general web search may find.

Login for full-text access

Use your TSDFT login details for full-text access to journal articles and eBooks (where available).

Type your search terms into the search box and click


You can enter keywords to run a general topic search or search for a specific book, journal or article title.

Links to other resources

Use databases like Medline or Cinahl to complete a more in-depth literature search or access the clinical decision-making resources like BMJ Best Practice for topic overviews.
